Dr. Rachel Britt, President

She is a Postdoctoral Fellow in Dr. Michael Lieber's lab at the Norris Comprehensive Cancer Center. The overall goal of her research is to determine why certain DNA regions in immune system cells are frequently broken and recombined in new configurations that lead the cells to become cancerous.



Dr. Susana Cavallero, Vice President

She is a Postdoctoral Research Associate in Dr. Henry Sucov's lab at the Broad Center for Regenerative Medicine and Stem Cell Research. Her research focuses on the identification of growth factors that influence the patterning of coronary blood vessels during heart development.



Dr. Reymundo Dominguez, Secretary

He is an NINDS Postdoctoral Fellow in the lab of Dr. Robert H. Chow at the Zilkha Neurogenetic Institute. The overall goal of his research is to study how membrane protein trafficking is linked to neuroprotective actions of steroid hormones.



Dr. Gilly Koritzky, Treasurer

She is a Postdoctoral Research Associate in the lab of Dr. Antoine Bechara at the Brain and Creativity Institute. Her research focuses on decision-making and other cognitive factors related to overeating and obesity.



Dr. Megan Rieger, HSC Networking Chair

She is a Postdoctoral Fellow in Dr. Zea Borok's lab at the Keck School of Medicine. She is supported by the Training Program in Viral and Chemical Carcinogenesis. She studies mechanisms regulating adult development and disease in the distal lung, particularly the function of FOXO1 in alveolar epithelial cell differentiation and tumor formation.



Dr. Ati Ghoreyshi, UPC Networking Chair

She is a Postdoctoral Research Associate at SangerLab in Biomedical Engineering. Her research focuses on probabilistic spike-based models of sensorimotor control and has led to the replication of a variety of human motor behaviors in simulations and on a robot arm, such as restorative reflexes, risk involved responses and motor learning.



Dr. Vikram Sorathia, Professional Development Chair

He is a Postdoctoral Research Associate at The Center for Interactive Smart Oilfield Technologies – a joint USC and Chevron center of excellence for research and academic training. His work in Prof. Viktor Prasanna's lab in the Viterbi School of Engineering focuses on integrated optimization.



Dr. Harianto Tjong, Information Technology Chair

He is a Postdoctoral Research Associate in Dr. Frank Alber's lab in Molecular and Computational Biology. He studies the higher order genome organizations while developing computational methods to infer the 3D structure of nucleic chromosomes of multiple organisms.

She is a Postdoctoral Research Associate in Dr. Ruth Wood's lab in Cell and Neurobiology at the Keck School of Medicine. She studies the relationship between the neurohormone oxytocin and affiliative social behavior in mice as a means to understanding disorders with social deficit phenotypes like Autism Spectrum Disorder.



Dr. Behzad Kharabi, CHLA Representative

He is a Postdoctoral Fellow in the lab of Dr. Markus Muschen at Children's Hospital Los Angeles. The overall goal of his research is to find novel mechanisms to target therapy-resistant leukemia.

She is a Postdoc at the House Research Institute. Her projects focus on development aspects of cell cycle regulation and epigenetic modifications of gene regulation as they relate to the inner ear, hearing loss and regeneration.



POSTDOCS NEWS

NEW POSTDOCTORAL BENEFITS PROGRAM- As of August 1st, 2012, The USC Office of Postdoctoral Affairs has removed discrepancies in benefits between Postdoctoral Research Associates and Postdoctoral Fellows. Prior to the change, Postdoctoral Research Associates received staff benefits while Fellows received student benefits. This discrepancy mostly affected those postdocs who were initially hired as Postdoctoral Research Associates and were then awarded an external fellowship. Despite the prestige of winning a fellowship and being supported with their own funds, these postdocs were automatically switched from "staff" to "student" status with the consequent reduction of their benefits. With the new plan, along with the prestige of a fellowship, fellows will receive benefits closely matched to those offered to faculty and staff, as will all newly hired Postdoctoral Research Associates and Teaching Fellows.

Postdoctoral Research Associates hired **BEFORE August 1**st will remain fully eligible for staff benefits, including the retirement plan. Faculty can **NOT** force postdocs to change to the new status and can **NOT** require postdocs to move to a lower benefit rate at the end of their current appointment.

MINIMUM SALARY FOR POSTDOCTORAL SCHOLARS- As a reflection of NIH's new salary guidelines, the minimum annual salary for all first-year Postdoctoral Scholars will be \$39,264 for FY13. This minimum applies to all newly appointed postdocs, and all renewed postdocs, on or after August 1st, 2012. Please make sure that your research administrators are aware of the new minimum salary. If you are a postdoc and you do NOT receive at least the minimum annual salary please contact Dr. Mark Todd at the Office of Postdoctoral Affairs (mtodd@provost.usc.edu) or the USC Postdoctoral Association (uscpda@usc.edu).




